# Rules for 2021 Virtual Conventions of

# State, Provincial and District Chapters

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic emergency, the Executive Board of International Chapter adopted the following rules for all 2021 virtual conventions of State, Provincial and District Chapters. These rules may not be amended.

A virtual convention for state, provincial and district chapters will be divided into two or more meetings. The opening meeting will contain all agenda items of business which require action by vote of members of convention. A second and subsequent meeting will contain only agenda items of business not requiring any action during convention.

# **General Rules**

- 1. A webcam video of the president shall be displayed throughout the convention.
- 2. A webcam video of a presenter may be displayed throughout the convention, if available.
- 3. Each voting member must have the contemporaneous ability during the opening meeting to submit a vote or ballot through the video platform's polling process on an individual device. Each voting member is limited to one device.
- 4. Each voting member of convention must be situated in a private location and shall be responsible for her connection to the Internet. No action shall be invalidated on the grounds that the loss of, or poor quality of, a member's individual connection prevented her from participating in the meeting.
- 5. Members' devices shall remain muted unless recognized to speak. A Technical Support specialist will operate the mute/unmute function.
- 6. A committee appointed by the president from voting members of convention has the responsibility to read and approve the minutes of convention.
- Members shall not record any portion of the business meetings, take screen shots or photos of presentations or slides, or post/share on the Internet, unless notified that this rule is suspended.
- 8. Amendments to state, provincial and district chapter bylaws and standing rules adopted at convention will take effect at the close of convention and as instructed in the bylaws.

# **Rules for Opening Meeting**

- Only voting members of convention as defined in the state, provincial or district chapter bylaws, designated participants and technical support specialists shall attend the opening meeting.
- 10. Voting members of convention shall register for the opening meeting using a specific registration link and will be verified when logging in to the platform.
- 11. Only voting members of convention shall sign in as **attendees** and maintain internet access when present throughout the opening meeting but sign out upon any permanent departure prior to adjournment. In the event a delegate must leave the remainder of the convention, the alternate shall register and be approved by the Credentials Committee.
- 12. Once a quorum is established in the opening meeting, the continued presence of a quorum shall be monitored by the online list of participants unless another quorum count is ordered by the president or convention. The list will be copied for the proceedings of convention.
- 13. Nominations "from the floor" shall be submitted in writing to the president and chairman of the Nominating Committee no later than 12:00 noon Central Time the Monday prior to the start of the opening meeting of convention in order to give the Nominating Committee time to verify the candidate meets the eligibility requirements and to gain her consent to be nominated.
- 14. The Chairman of Amendments and Recommendation Committee will read only the explanation provided for all proposed amendments.
- 15. Proposed amendments presented "as a block" are voted upon as one without debate and a single vote. A request for information on any of the items is allowed and a member may request an amendment be pulled from the block for separate consideration and vote. A request to pull an amendment shall be submitted in writing to the president and chairman of the Amendments and Recommendations Committee no later than 12:00 noon Central Time the Monday prior to the start of the opening meeting of convention.
- 16. In the interest of time and for clear communication, a member intending to introduce a main motion or offer a motion to amend to any business that has been noticed prior to convention shall submit it in writing to the president and chairman of the Amendments and Recommendations Committee no later than 12:00 noon Central Time the Monday prior to the start of the opening meeting of convention.
- 17. To seek recognition to speak, a member shall click "Q&A" in the Webinar controls and enter her name, chapter letter(s) or title, and indicate purpose: PRO, CON, Request for Information. A queue of speakers is electronically established for each motion and the queue will be cleared when the motion is disposed of. The president will alternate between those speaking pro and con. Priority recognition is given to a Request for Information.


# **Rules for Opening Meeting – continued**

18. A member addressing the president shall state her name, chapter letter(s) or title and purpose. A member will be limited to speak once for one (1) minute on each motion. Total time clock on a proposed amendment or resolution shall be limited to seven (7) minutes. Items considered seriatim shall be limited to four (4) minutes per amendment within the group with an additional two (2) minutes allowed for the group as a whole.

If a motion to amend is presented pursuant to Rule #16, the total time clock will be paused, and a five (5) minute time limit will be set for consideration of the motion to amend. Upon disposition of the motion to amend, the president will restart the total time clock and resume consideration of the pending motion.

A question asked under a request for information is not counted as individual debate time but does count toward the total time clock for the amendment. The clock for an individual to answer will pause for the time required to respond to a request for information and as ordered by the president.

- 19. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic emergency, the approved method of voting is by ballot taken electronically by Zoom polling. The president shall announce the result.
- 20. A total time of 45 seconds will be given to complete voting on each Zoom poll.
- 21. All items of business which require action by vote of members of convention shall be contained within the scheduled opening meeting.

# **First Business Meeting**

The 65th Annual Convention of Georgia State Chapter of the P.E.O. Sisterhood convened at 9:03 AM on Saturday, May 1<sup>st</sup>, 2021, through full-featured internet meeting services. Chapters L, S, AK, AS, AT, BB and BH served as hostesses.

The meeting was called to order by President Sharon Morton, BM at 9:04 AM.

The president welcomed all attendees and explained the Opening Meeting format to conduct essential voting business.



# **Sample Voting Procedure**

The president called on Dottie Fielder, AH, Chairman of the Amendments and Recommendations Committee, to assist in conducting a sample discussion and electronic vote.

# **First Credentials Report**

The first Credentials Report was given by Francy DeBartola, AY, PSP, Chairman of the Credentials Committee.

Chairman Francy DeBartola reported 172 members of convention entitled to vote. Francy DeBartola moved and it was seconded that the report be adopted. An electronic vote was taken with the following results: 161 votes cast, 82 votes necessary for adoption by majority, 161 affirmative and 0 negative. The report was adopted. (Pages 80-82)

# **Declaring A Quorum**

Quorum was established through a poll taken to verify a majority of local chapter representation.

# **Adoption of Convention Rules and Program**

Attention was called to the Rules of Convention as adopted by the Executive Board of International Chapter. (Pages 9-11)

Kathleen Blake, A, Secretary, moved the adoption of the distributed Convention Program with necessary changes. The motion was seconded, and an electronic vote was taken with the following results: 165 votes cast, 84 votes necessary for adoption by majority, 165 affirmative and 0 negative. The motion was adopted.

# **Declaring the Formal Opening**

A quorum being present, the president declared the 65th Convention of Georgia State Chapter opened in due form and ready for the transaction of business.

# **Convention Appointments**

The members of the Committee to Approve Minutes of Convention were introduced and thanked for assisting the secretary with the minutes: Amanda Ripley, BS; Betty "BJ" Jones, AA; Peery Moran, AI, and adviser Kathie White, AY, PSP.

The president announced that Grace Chalker, AE/OH, PSP was appointed convention parliamentarian by the President of International Chapter.

# **Granting New Chapter Charters and Chapter City Designation Change**

President Sharon Morton recognized organizer Nancy Burk, BK, who moved that a charter be granted to Chapter BT, Cumming. There was a second and an electronic vote was taken with the following results: 164 votes cast, 83 votes necessary for adoption by majority, 164 affirmative and 0 negative. The motion was adopted.

President Sharon Morton recognized organizer Nancy Burk, who moved that a charter be granted to Chapter BU, Tifton. There was a second and an electronic vote was taken with the following results: 166 votes cast, 84 votes necessary for adoption by majority, 166 affirmative and 0 negative. The motion was adopted.

The president announced a city of designation change for Chapter F from Atlanta to Snellville, effective February 8, 2020.

# **Final Credentials Report**

The final Credentials Report was given by chairman Francy DeBartola. Chairman Francy DeBartola reported no changes to the credentials report. Quorum was established through a poll taken to verify a majority of local chapter representation. (Pages 80-82)

# **Report of Nominating Committee**

Sue Hauseman, BP, PSP, Nominating Committee Chairman, introduced her committee: Lois Gerstenlauer, W; Peggy Green, BE; Judy Hood, BR; Linda Martin, BM, PSP and gave the report of the Nominating Committee. The president thanked the committee for their work. (Page 50)

The next order of business was election of officers.

There being no further nominations from the floor, the nominations were declared closed. An electronic vote was taken for the entire slate of officers. There being a majority in the affirmative, the entire slate as presented by the Nominating Committee was elected as officers of Georgia State Chapter for the ensuing year.

# **Report of the Amendments and Recommendations Committee**

In preparation for the presentation of amendments to the Bylaws and Standing Rules of Georgia State Chapter, the president instructed the convention in the procedure for presentation of amendments and voting. She announced that adopted amendments would take effect at the close of convention and as specified in the Bylaws and Standing Rules of Georgia State Chapter.

The report of the Amendments and Recommendations Committee was given by the chairman, Dottie Fielder, who first introduced the other members of the committee: Lynn Harwell, AR, PSP and Diane Turnbull, AC.

A&R Chairman, Dottie Fielder, presented the 2021 proposed amendments to the Bylaws of Georgia State Chapter. Page numbers refer to the Bylaws and Standing Rules as contained in the 2020 Report of the Year.

1. Amendment #1 was withdrawn.

The following two proposed amendments were considered seriatim.

2. Submitted by the Finance Committee of Georgia State Chapter (page BL-3) Amend Article IV, Section 1, by adding a new paragraph 3 as follows:

Allocation of Dues The Georgia State Chapter Finance Committee shall recommend an annual allocation of dues to state chapter funds, with the approval of the executive board, for consideration and adoption by convention of the state chapter.

- 3. Submitted by the Finance Committee of Georgia State Chapter (page BL-9) Amend Article VII, Section 5, subsection B, by adding a new item 3 as follows:
  - 3. To prepare and present to convention of state chapter a proposed allocation of state chapter dues.

An electronic vote was taken with the following results: 129 votes cast, 86 votes necessary for adoption by two-thirds, 129 affirmative and 0 negative. The amendments were adopted.

 Submitted by the Executive Board of Georgia State Chapter (page BL-12) Amend Article VIII, Section 2, by striking out subsection C.

After brief discussion, an electronic vote was taken with the following results: 165 votes cast, 110 votes necessary for adoption by two-thirds, 118 affirmative and 47 negative. The amendment was adopted.

At the direction of the A&R Committee, the A&R Chairman moved the adoption of the following editorial resolution:

Resolved, That the 2021 – 2022 Executive Board of Georgia State Chapter be authorized to correct article and section designations, punctuation and cross-references, and to make such other technical and conforming changes as may be necessary to reflect the intent of Georgia State Chapter.

An electronic vote was taken with the following results: 165 votes cast, 84 votes necessary for adoption by majority, 164 affirmative and 1 negative. The amendment was adopted.

The president thanked the members of the committee for their work.

### **Report of the Finance Committee**

President Sharon Morton called attention to the copy of the proposed budget provided to each member of convention. She introduced the Finance Committee Chairman, Betty Varnadore, AD, who introduced other members of her committee: Kathie White, AY, PSP and Stacy Drew, N. (Pages 51,52-55).

The chairman moved the adoption of the report. The vote was divided into three parts:

- (1) Adoption of the budget. An electronic vote was taken with the following results: 164 votes cast, 83 votes necessary for adoption by majority, 164 affirmative and 0 negative. The budget was adopted.
- (2) Transfer of funds. Transfer \$16,000 of the surplus from the General Fund for the closed 2020-2021 fiscal year be transferred to the General Reserve Fund, to restore amounts previously transferred for use in covering the extra expenses of three years of an independent audit, for two book printings and for the sesquicentennial celebration. In addition, the committee recommended a transfer from the General Fund of \$14,000 to the State Convention Fund and \$5,000 to the International Travel Fund. An electronic vote was taken with the following results: 159 votes cast, 81 votes necessary for adoption by majority, 159 affirmative and 0 negative. The transfer of funds was adopted.
- (3) The remainder of the report. An electronic vote was taken with the following results: 167 votes cast, 85 votes necessary for adoption by majority, 167 affirmative and 0 negative. The remainder of the report was adopted.

The President stated that the adoption of the report approved the report of the treasurer.

The president thanked the members of the Finance Committee for their careful attention to the financial details of Georgia State Chapter this past year. She announced the audit reports for fiscal years 2019-2020 and 2020-2021 are available on the Georgia website.

There was no unfinished business requiring a vote of convention.

The president thanked Chairman of Tellers, Amanda von Oldenburg, BQ, the Registration Committee and the Credentials Committee for their assistance throughout the opening meeting.

The president declared the meeting adjourned at 10:13 AM until 2:15 PM.





#### **Annual Report of the Finance Committee**

In accordance with the duties defined in the P.E.O. Constitution and the Bylaws and Standing Rules of Georgia State Chapter, the Finance Committee submits the following report:

Reports of Georgia State Chapter officers and committees containing accounts of receipts and expenditures of state chapter funds have been examined. An audit of the financial records of Georgia State Chapter was completed by the independent CPA firm of Denman & Co., LLC, West Des Moines, Iowa and found to be in agreement with the financial reporting of the state treasurer.

The budget for 2021-2022, retroactive to April 1, has been prepared after careful study of the receipts and expenditures for the past year and is submitted to the convention for adoption. The budget was emailed April 26, 2021, to voting members prior to the convention.

The committee recommends \$16,000 of the surplus from the General Fund for the closed 2020-2021 fiscal year be transferred to the General Reserve Fund, to restore amounts previously transferred for use in covering the extra expenses of three years of an independent audit, for two book printings and for the sesquicentennial celebration. In addition, the committee recommends a transfer from the General Fund of \$14,000 to the State Convention Fund and \$5,000 to the International Travel Fund.

Sincere gratitude is extended to Committee members Kathie White, AY, PSP and Stacy Drew, N, for their support and teamwork and to Francy DeBartola, AY, PSP, FDA, for her wealth of knowledge, assistance, and dedication. The Georgia Executive Board and Financial Committee sisters continually guard the monies entrusted to them with great care.

#### **Annual Report of International Projects Committee**



#### Annual Report of the P.E.O. International Peace Scholarship Committee



The International Peace Scholarship Fund was established in 1949 to provide scholarships for women from other countries for graduate study in the United States or Canada. Members of P.E.O. believe that education is fundamental to world peace and understanding. The scholarship is based upon demonstrated need; however, the award is not intended to cover all academic or personal expenses. The maximum amount awarded to a student is \$12,500, though lesser amounts may be awarded according to individual needs.

Due to the global pandemic, many of the 2020-2021 IPS students faced obstacles related to travel and visa restrictions. However, IPS students arrived in the U.S. and Canada hoping to achieve their educational goals through the support of the P.E.O. International Peace Scholarship Fund. IPS Recipients from 74 countries were awarded 212 scholarships totaling \$2,211,000.

The Partners in Peace Program provides P.E.O. chapters a way to make a special donation to P.E.O. International Peace Scholarship Fund and have an IPS recipient partnered with them. This year 23 Georgia chapters obtained Partners in Peace status:

#### Annual Report of the P.E.O. Program for Continuing Education

The Program for Continuing Educational (PCE), established in 1973, is a need-based grant program providing one-time financial assistance to women who education has been interrupted and find it necessary to return to school to complete a degree or certification that will improve their marketable skills for employment to support themselves and their families. The maximum one-time grant is \$3,000, though lesser amounts may be awarded based on funds available in the current year's grant budget and applicants' individual needs.

Applications were submitted between March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2020 and February 28<sup>th</sup>, 2021. Ten PCE grants were awarded across Georgia totaling \$21,900. There were three (3) who received the full \$3,000 award. This includes 4 master's degree, 1 bachelor's degree, 1 associate degree, and 4 certificates. #### **Annual Report of the Cottey College Committee**

In August, the committee met, via Zoom, with Katie Henry Z, Adviser and our State President, Sharon Morton., BM. Policy and Procedures were revised and objectives for the 2020-2021 year were established. The Committee members and Katie Henry attended two additional Zoom meetings during the 2020-2021 year.

The committee divided Georgia's 68 chapters into three Cottey Families. Each family has an assigned "Cottey Companion." The committee discovered that dividing the chapters into Families encouraged communication between the committee and individual chapters. All committee members report they have written and/or spoken to many of "their" chapters during the year Monthly newsletters have been sent to each chapter keeping them updated on the news and events taking place at Cottey.

To reach as many high schools as possible a request was sent to every chapter to send the names and e-mail addresses of High School Guidance Counselors to Kevan Snyder, Chairman. Over 200 names of Guidance Counselors from the public, private and the Home School network were submitted to the committee. Every submission was sent a personal e-mail with an interactive letter, created by Stephanie Grgurich at Cottey College and approved by Sharon Morton, Georgia State President. Roughly 80% of these messages reached their intended contact, and the committee feels they were successful at getting the word out throughout Georgia about Cottey College. A data base was created to be used in the future to keep this important group of educators informed about Cottey.

Monthly updates to the Georgia Website were posted. This year a "hot link" was created so that sisters could reach the Cottey Website from our Georgia website home page.

#### **Annual Report of the Membership Committee**

The 2020-2021 Georgia State Membership Committee consisted of Theresa Hutch, BO, Chairman; Kathy Henry, BM, 2<sup>nd</sup> Year Member; Dona Evans, BJ, 1<sup>st</sup> Year Member; Melinda Garver, PSP, BA, Ad Hoc member; Erika Dame, BS, Ad Hoc member; and Whitney Myers, Z, Unaffliate Coordinator. The committee advisor was Nancy Burk, BK, Georgia State Organizer. Katie Henry, Z, Georgia State Treasurer served as an ex-officio member of the committee.

The first meeting was in July 2020 conducted via Zoom with all the committee members and GA State President, Sharon Morton, BM, present. We reviewed the folders on Google Drive, discussed the need to keep the Membership page on Georgia State website updated, and reviewed the MDF Plan for 2020-2021. We approved the inactive letter and survey to be sent to Chapter Presidents and Membership Chairs with a response date of September 25<sup>th</sup>.

There was discussion on the Ad Hoc positions and the need to create clear Policies and Procedures for these positions. The Membership Committee P&Ps were addressed as well. These have not been updated since 2016 and a deadline of December 31<sup>st</sup> was given to submit suggested revisions.

#### **Annual Report of the Unaffiliate Coordinator**

It was a pleasure to serve as the Unaffiliate Coordinator for the state of Georgia during the 2020 - 2021 year. This position was established 5 years ago to organize the unaffiliates in Georgia state. This was my second year serving in the position.

For the first half of the year, the work was organized in the following way:

- Assigned each active unaffiliate in the database to a nearby chapter (274 unaffiliates assigned to 64 of Georgia's 68 chapters)
- Created a Google sheet for each chapter with their unaffiliates
- Created instructions and templates to use for outreach
- Collected responses from chapters with a deadline of December 1

Responses from 47% of chapters was received, down from 67% last year. Work continues on compiling the results to be uploaded to the membership database.

Over the summer, we received feedback from our Regional Membership Representative recommending we reach out to new unaffiliates each month instead of once per year to try to connect with them as soon as they move. It was proposed to the state organizer to make these changes to the Unaffiliate Coordinator Policies and Procedures. The state board voted on these changes and they were approved in October 2020.

Starting in October 2020, the work was organized in the following way:

- Pull new unaffiliates for the previous month from the membership database (Typically this was done within the first few days of each new month)
- Email new unaffiliates welcoming them to GA and asking if they would like to connect with a local chapter
- Depending on member preferences, email local chapter presidents and membership chairs and ask them to reach out
- Ask the unaffiliate to let me know if she does not hear back (rare)
- Maintain a tracking spreadsheet in Google Drive so that the committee has visibility to the list and notes for each unaffiliate
- Collaborate with the Membership Committee as needed

From September 1, 2020, through January 31, 2020, we have had 51 new unaffiliates, or an average of 10 per month. We have heard from around 50% of these members. Many are still connecting to their chapters via Zoom and are not yet ready to transfer.

To support the Membership Committee, a variety of tools were created, surveys, and maps for managing membership. Matching of cities to areas listed in the Membership Portal was completed including cleaning up misspelled cities.

It has been an honor to serve on the Membership Committee and help support the health of the P.E.O. chapters of Georgia.

#### **Annual Report of the Georgia Scholarship Committee**

The members of the 2020-2021 scholarship committee were Debbie Lundell, H, Chairman, Babs Leutz, BT, Louise Hamilton, BA, and Deb Smith, D adviser.

The committee had three Zoom meetings. During the first meeting, the Policies and Procedures were reviewed and amended, the application package was updated, and the committee chose an essay prompt. The second meeting was a discussion of scoring criteria, and at the third meeting, the committee decided to award 42 scholarships.

During the year, the committee updated all the notebooks to ensure that each member has a Statement of Operation for each fund, made the application form fillable, evaluated 75 applications, and completed all duties as outlined in the Policies and Procedures. The chairman also verified that all winners for the 2020 school year received their scholarship money.

The committee received 75 applications from 34 chapters. The 42 winners were from 20 different chapters and will receive a total of \$45,250 in scholarship money. All chapters and applicants were notified by email and letter when verification was received from the P.E.O. Foundation.


#### **Annual Report of the Technology Committee**

This year, the GA State Technology Committee (consisting of Chair Ashleigh Rioux, V and Co-Chair Megan Woods, A) met quarterly to discuss committee goals and brainstorm new ideas.

Official Duties of the committee include but are not limited to: To communicate all changes made to the Georgia State Chapter website, <a href="peogeorgia.org">peogeorgia.org</a>; to moderate all activity on our P.E.O. Georgia State Chapter social media pages, Facebook: "Georgia State Chapter P.E.O" and Instagram: "Georgia State Chapter PEO"; to advise and consult the executive board of the state chapter and serve as a resource to the state chapter and local chapters for the state's present and future technology needs.

The Technology Committee continued the use of the Gmail account to communicate
with local chapters and send the monthly tech notes with all additions to the
peogeorgia.org website. The committee also utilizes the google drive to keep historical
documents which can be passed down to future tech committees.

- They have also focused on expanding P.E.O. GA State Chapter's presence on social media and share informational links to the GA State Website to help communicate upcoming events, deadlines, and general answers to our state website FAQs.
- Our Facebook Group "Georgia State Chapter P.E.O." continues to perform well. 167
  new members have joined the Facebook group this year bringing our total group
  members to 586 sisters.
- 90% of our Facebook group consist of "Active" participants per Facebook algorithms and analytics – meaning 521 of our group members consistently viewed, posted, or interacted with our posts in the form of comments and likes.
- Group engagement also continues to increase in the form of creative content posted, comments, and reactions (ex- "Likes") on our Facebook Group.
- This year we had:
  - o 275 Posts, 2003 Comments, and 9340 Reactions (example "Likes")
  - The busiest time of the year for group interaction revolved around the 2020 "Virtual Celebration" in honor of what would have been our 2020 GA State Convention weekend.



- Other analytics showed that more than 50% of our Facebook group is age 65+ and the best dates and times for activity were weekends and during the afternoon.
- Our official GA State P.E.O. Instagram account (Georgia State Chapter PEO) also continues to gain attention. We post P.E.O. related photos including fundraising ideas, chapter birthdays, previous convention photos, etc. and currently has 25 posts and 55 followers as of March 4, 2021.

The Technology committee is also heavily involved with all the Audio / Visual needs for state convention. When the 2020 Georgia State Convention was cancelled due to Covid-19 our committee immediately got to work to see how we can bring some of the highlights of convention weekend to our sisters on a digital platform. This led to our "2020 P.E.O. Virtual Celebration". Now with the decision to bring our 2021 GA State convention "Virtual" in a brand-new way via Zoom, the committee along with the State Executive board and P.E.O. international are working hard to "Share the Magic of P.E.O."

After a year of uncertainty, our sisters turned to technology to stay close while socially distanced. Our committee was happy to virtually celebrate the years accomplishments with our "Virtual Celebration", help local chapters navigate new virtual meeting platforms, and help sisters stay connected via social media with the goal of continuing to express a loving concern for each sister. The Technology Committee is excited to explore new ways to intertwine our sisterhood with technology in 2021 and beyond.

# Convention Devotion May 1, 2021

Good afternoon members of the Georgia State Chapter and our distinguished Guest: Grace Chalker, PSP/OH, Chairman of Trustees for Cottey College.

Some of my favorite memories of P.E.O. are from attending various conventions. My first was the 1993 International Convention in Atlanta the year after I became a P.E.O. Since then, I have served as a delegate or state committee chairman for countless Georgia State Conventions. Being able to gather together as sisters with the goals of nurturing our sisterhood and helping women reach for the stars is a wonderful experience. The ceremony, celebrations and call to a common purpose provides the means for connecting with amazing women and obtaining perspective on the full import of P.E.O. Learning from our project recipients of the impact they have in our world, honoring our sisters in Chapter Eternal, hearing about the vision for the future of our sisterhood and sharing meals with sisters from other chapters stirs an energy for P.E.O. that can be hard to fully describe.

Our president, Sharon Morton, Chapter BM, may have been inspired by this feeling when she chose her theme for this year: "Let's Share the Magic of P.E.O."

Magic is one of the oldest performing arts. From theaters to children's birthdays, magic can be found just about everywhere. Magicians do not reveal their tricks because we are no longer amazed when we know how the trick works. That mystery of "how" is what keeps us fascinated and stirs our sense of wonder; opens our imaginations; and gives us a thrill.

"The founders were charmed by the idea of P.E.O. and by the magic of working together for the advancement of women—a new concept at that time. 152 years later we are here to conduct the business of our beloved P.E.O. I believe our founders would be astounded at all that P.E.O. has accomplished in the time since they first sewed their aprons and paraded into the chapel. Historically P.E.O. has weathered adversity through multiple wars, pandemics, and economic downturns—all the while raising funding for scholarships, grants, loans, publications and buildings.

Part of the magic of P.E.O. emanates from our adherence to ideas and ideals set forth by our founders and honoring those traditions has carried us for 150 years. Then came 2020. Just before the new P.E.O. year began, so did a global pandemic. The world nearly came to a halt. Schools closed, jobs ended, lives were lost, civil unrest persisted. Our P.E.O. leadership began reworking our policies and procedures to ensure the safety of our members while promoting the business and goals of our sisterhood during an unprecedented time in our modern history. Meetings and conventions were cancelled; new technologies and meeting formats were established. The act of sisterhood and friendship had to be redefined while we were "sheltering in place."

Following our P.E.O. leadership, our local chapters took on the task of supporting our sisters and promoting the goals of the sisterhood, embracing new policies and procedures, new technologies and new means of recruitment. Last Fall we were able to resume meetings and, now conventions, albeit with hybrid and virtual formats. P.E.O. has once again, persevered through adversity in the world to achieve our lofty goals. To date, we have helped nearly 114,000 women pursue educational goals by providing over \$369 million in educational assistance. Amazing things can be accomplished when women gather together for a common purpose. It's magical.

Today we are on the brink of coming through this pandemic and it is our hope to meet in person again: to see one another will be an awesome experience. We have been missing hugging and fellowshipping with each other this past year. My heart warms just thinking about those meetings. It will be amazing, in fact, it will be magical.

Let us celebrate the magic of P.E.O.: Sisters working together to promote the education of women worldwide. Let the magic stir our sense of wonder, open our imaginations, and give us hope for our future. The magic of P.E.O. is the legacy of our founders—passed down through generations of women and the legacy my mother lovingly gave to me. Let's share the magic.

#### BYLAWS OF GEORGIA STATE CHAPTER P.E.O.

#### 2021-2022

#### Last Amended May 1, 2021

#### **ARTICLE 1**

#### **CONVENTION OF STATE CHAPTER**

**Section 1. TIME** The convention of the Georgia State Chapter shall be held annually in April, May or June. The date shall be determined by the executive board in consultation with the hostess chapters. In case of emergency, the executive board may change the time of the meeting.

**Section 2. FORMAL ACTION** Any item passed by convention of the state chapter which must be implemented by local chapters shall become effective immediately upon receipt of official communication.

**Section 3. CHAPTER GROUPING** The convention shall be hosted by five or more local chapters, grouped geographically for convenience and economy. Chapter grouping shall be made by the Grouping Committee and shall be announced at each convention for a four-year period.

#### **Section 4. HOSTESS CHAPTERS**

- **A.** The hostess chapters, with consent of the one who will be president of Georgia State Chapter at the time of convention, shall determine the place of convention and, in case of emergency, shall make necessary changes.
- **B.** Hostess chapters shall receive moneys in the State Convention Fund for payment of necessary expenses as determined by the executive board and Finance Committee. Such moneys shall be used for convention expenses. Unused State Convention Fund moneys shall remain in the State Convention Fund.
- **C.** The Hostess Chapter Convention Manuals, containing all pertinent information and facts in regard to plans and preparations for convention, shall be maintained on the Georgia website.
- D. Within two months following convention of the state chapter, the finance chairman for the hostess chapters shall prepare a final financial statement and budget and send electronic copies to the immediate past president, current board members and the chairman of the Finance Committee of Georgia State Chapter.

#### REPRESENTATION IN STATE CHAPTER CONVENTION

**Section 1. MEMBERS** The Convention of Georgia State Chapter shall be composed of the following members:

Executive board

Past presidents of state chapter

Resident past presidents of International Chapter

Two elected delegates for each chapter, the president being a delegate when feasible

Chairman of Amendments and Recommendations Committee

Chairman of Finance Committee

Chairman of Grouping Committee

Historian

Chairman of Membership Committee

Chairman of Nominating Committee

Chairman of Scholarship Committee

Chairman of Technology Committee

**Unaffiliate Coordinator** 

Chairman of Cottey College Committee

International Projects Committee of three members for the P.E.O. Projects (ELF, PCE, IPS, PSA, and STAR).

**Section 2. DELEGATES** At the annual election each local chapter shall elect two delegates and two alternates to the Convention of Georgia State Chapter. The first alternate shall fill the first vacancy and the second alternate shall fill the second vacancy.

**Section 3. CHAIRMEN** When the chairman of a standing committee is unable to attend convention, another member of said committee may be seated and vote in place of the chairman.

**Section 4**. **VISITORS** Each visitor must register and receive a name tag to attend any business meeting of convention of Georgia State Chapter.

#### **ARTICLE III**

#### REPRESENTATION IN INTERNATIONAL CHAPTER CONVENTION

**Section 1. MEMBERS** Representation to the Convention of International Chapter shall be as provided in the Constitution, Part I, Article II, Section I. The chapters in the state shall be divided into groups of seven chapters, or major fractions thereof, and chosen in rotation by the Grouping Committee. The changes and assignments of the new chapters shall be made by the committee. A list of chapters entitled to representation in the succeeding Convention of International Chapter shall be printed in the proceedings of the Convention of Georgia State Chapter.

**Section 2. ELECTION** In the year of Convention of International Chapter each local chapter so notified shall nominate at the annual election a delegate and an alternate, whose names shall be submitted as required by International Chapter. Nominees shall be members of convention of the state chapter or of any previous Convention of Georgia State Chapter. The names of the delegates so nominated shall be presented to the Convention of Georgia State Chapter by the secretary for election.

**Section 3. VACANCY** In case of a vacancy, the president of the state chapter shall appoint a delegate:

first, the nominee for alternate; second, another member of the chapter entitled to representation; third, a member of another chapter in the group; fourth, a member of the state chapter.

**Section 4. PAST PRESIDENTS** The active past presidents shall determine which of their number shall receive housing, meals and transportation at Convention of International Chapter.

**Section 5. REPORTS** Each member of the Georgia delegation to a Convention of International Chapter receiving housing, meals and transportation shall give a personal report on convention activities to local chapters as assigned by the president of Georgia State Chapter within eight weeks after convention. Past state presidents, not receiving housing, meals and transportation may assist in giving reports. If a report cannot be given in person, a written report may be authorized by the president of the state chapter. Each delegate shall notify the state chapter president when all reports have been given.

#### **ARTICLE IV**

#### **FINANCE**

**Section 1. DUES** The annual dues of Georgia State chapter shall be forty-six dollars (\$46.00) per active member, which shall be allocated as follows:

Twenty-six dollars (\$26.00) International Chapter dues, which shall include six dollars (\$6.00) for Cottey College and twenty dollars (\$20.00) Georgia State Chapter dues.

**Allocation of Dues** The Georgia State Chapter Finance Committee shall recommend an annual allocation of dues to state chapter funds, with the approval of the executive board, for consideration and adoption by convention of the state chapter.

#### Section 2. CONVENTION OF STATE CHAPTER

- **A. LOCAL CHAPTER** Each local chapter shall, before convention, pay to the Meals and Lodging Chairman of hostess chapters, the required cost of meals and lodging for two delegates.
- **B. GEORGIA STATE CHAPTER CONVENTION FUND** Georgia State Chapter shall maintain a Georgia State Chapter Convention Fund. The fund shall cover the expenses for the following:
  - 1. Georgia State Executive Board
  - 2. Standing Committee Chairman
  - 3. Ad Hoc and Special Committee Appointments (Chairman only)
  - 4. Convention Appointees
  - 5. Convention Guests/Speakers
  - 6. State Sponsored Events
  - 7. Rentals
  - 8. Printing
  - 9. Additional needs of the fund shall be reviewed and determined annually by the executive board and Finance Committee.

#### Section 3. CONVENTION OF INTERNATIONAL CHAPTER

- A. Georgia State Chapter shall pay the most economical and practical expense of transportation to convention for its president, vice president, organizer, treasurer, secretary, chapter delegates and past state presidents entitled to housing and meals. A delegate who does not accompany the state delegation shall receive, upon submission of receipts or other documentation, expenses not to exceed the proportionate amount paid for other delegates. Unusual circumstances requiring additional travel expenses will be considered and decided by the executive board.
- **B.** Each member of the Georgia delegation to a Convention of International Chapter receiving transportation expenses may also be allowed additional lodging and incidental expenses at a rate predetermined by the executive board with approval of the Finance Committee. Receipts or other documentation must be submitted within three months of convention.
- **C.** Delegates to Convention of International Chapter traveling to make reports will be allowed reimbursement as established by the executive board and Finance Committee.
- **D.** Additional convention expenses of the organizer, treasurer, and secretary may be authorized by the executive board.

**Section 4. INTERNATIONAL CHAPTER TRAVEL FUND** Georgia State Chapter shall maintain an International Travel Fund. The fund shall cover expenses for the following:

- **A.** Delegates to Convention of International Chapter including their transportation in reporting to local chapters.
- **B.** Officers attending the annual LEAD Conference.
- **C.** One trip for the LEAD Conference Heritage Tour to Mt. Pleasant during either the organizer's year or the president's year.
- **D.** Officers and chairmen attending the biennial Cottey College Seminar.
- **E.** Additional needs of the fund shall be reviewed and determined annually by the executive board and Finance Committee.

**Section 5. STATE OFFICERS** The Georgia State Chapter shall pay all necessary expenses of its officers conducting the business of the state chapter. Officers of the state chapter shall submit an itemized account of expenditures, with documented receipts attached, to the state president at each meeting of the executive board. A summary of officers' expenses shall be prepared for the Finance Committee chairman.

#### Section 6. COMMITTEES

- **A. Convention Expenses** Georgia State Chapter shall pay necessary state convention expenses of the chairmen of standing and special committees and all members of the International Projects Committee as authorized by the executive board, unless said chairman or committee member is a chapter delegate.
- **B.** Committee Expenses Georgia State Chapter shall pay the necessary committee expenses of all standing and special committees as authorized by the executive board. No meetings of these committees involving travel expenses shall be held without the approval of the president. All committee expense accounts shall be prepared in duplicate by the chairman, with documented receipts attached, and submitted to the president by March 10.
- **Section 7. ORGANIZATION AND OFFICIAL VISITS** Each chapter shall provide for lodging, when necessary, for the organizer or her proxy when an officer is conducting official business for that chapter.

**Section 8. LATE REPORTS** A fine of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) shall be billed to the chapter and paid to the treasurer of the state chapter by any local chapter when:

- A. the annual report of the treasurer
- B. the annual report of the corresponding secretary

is not forwarded to the proper state officer, postmarked no later than March 10. The fine applies to each late report. (Refer to ARTICLE X)

Section 9. LATE YEARBOOKS, LOCAL CHAPTER BYLAWS AND STANDING RULES, AND LOCAL CHAPTER PRESIDENT'S LETTER. A fine of five dollars (\$5.00) shall be billed to the chapter and paid to the treasurer of the state chapter by any local chapter when:

- **A.** Six local chapter yearbooks are sent to the chapter's designated executive board buddy postmarked later than July 1.
- **B.** The status of local chapter bylaws and standing rules is received by the chapter's designated executive board buddy later than March 10<sup>th</sup>.
- C. The local chapter president's letter is sent to the state president after March 10<sup>th</sup>.

This applies to each individual late report and each individual late yearbook. (Refer to Article X.)

**Section 10. FISCAL YEAR AND FINANCIAL YEAR** The fiscal year of Georgia State Chapter shall be from April 1 through March 31 of the following year. At the close of the fiscal year, the books of Georgia State Chapter shall undergo a financial review by a qualified accountant or auditing committee approved by the executive board.

**Section 11. INVESTMENT OF FUNDS** The treasurer and the executive board shall be authorized to invest funds of Georgia State Chapter.

#### **ARTICLE V**

#### **OFFICERS OF STATE CHAPTER**

#### Section 1. ELIGIBILITY

- **A.** New chapters must be represented in Convention of Georgia State Chapter once before their delegates are eligible to hold a state office.
- **B.** A nominee for office on the executive board shall have been duly elected, installed and shall have served as president of a local chapter for one term.

**Section 2. SEQUENCE OF OFFICERS** The sequence of state chapter officers shall be: president, vice president, organizer, treasurer, and secretary.

#### Section 3. NOMINATION

- **A.** The president shall appoint a nominating committee of five members which shall include at least one past state president. The president shall designate the chairman.
- **B.** Recommendations for nominees may be made by a majority written ballot of the executive board, a local chapter, the Nominating Committee, or a standing committee.
- **C.** A chapter, board or standing committee wishing to recommend an eligible member for consideration shall submit her name and qualification, with the written consent to serve if elected, to the chairman of the Nominating Committee by February 15. The chosen nominees must be members of the convention at which their names are presented.
- **D.** At convention of the state chapter, the committee shall present one name for each office. Further nominations may be made from the floor preceding the elective ballot for the office. Prior to nomination all nominees shall have consented to serve if elected.

**Section 4. INSTALLATION** If installation does not take place within sixty days of the close of convention of state chapter, the office shall be declared vacant.

#### **ARTICLE VI**

#### **SPECIAL DUTIES OF STATE OFFICERS**

Section 1. PRESIDENT The duties of the president of Georgia State Chapter shall be

- **A.** To appoint, with the approval of the executive board, all state standing committees as defined in Article VII.
- **B.** To fill vacancies, with approval by the executive board, for which no other provision has been made.
- **C.** To serve as chairman of the state chapter delegation to Convention of International Chapter.

- **D.** To serve as an ex-officio member, without vote, of all state committees except the Nominating Committee.
- **E.** To coordinate the review, update, and distribution of the Hostess Chapter Convention Manuals with the assistance of the immediate past convention chairman, vice president, and immediate past state president.
- F. To appoint, with the approval of the executive board, a special committee and/or task force.

#### Section 2. VICE PRESIDENT The duties of the vice president shall be

- **A.** To serve as adviser to the Scholarship Committee, the Grouping Committee, and the Technology Committee.
- B. To serve as ex-officio member, without vote, of the Finance Committee.
- C. To receive new programs for approval and review and keep current all Program Library materials.
- **D.** To prepare a résumé of the local chapter presidents' letters to the state president and to present this résumé to the convention of state chapter.
- **E.** To serve as adviser to reciprocity groups and P.E.O. Groups and forward the reciprocity reference list to the P.E.O. Record office by the required date.

#### Section 3. ORGANIZER The duties of the organizer shall be

- **A.** To make plans and direct proxies, appointed by the president, for official visits of chapters. In consultation with the president, determine the appropriate form of visit to promote the uniformity of procedure: (a) a comprehensive official visit to a new chapter annually for its first three years and (b) all chapters on a rotation basis.
- **B.** To plan workshops for local chapter officers as directed by the executive board.
- C. To serve as adviser to the Membership Committee and the Unaffiliate Coordinator.
- **D.** To serve as ex-officio member, without vote, of the Finance Committee.

#### **Section 4. TREASURER** The duties of the treasurer shall be

- **A.** To serve as custodian of all moneys and funds of Georgia State Chapter, reporting summaries and amounts of same.
- **B.** To inform the president of the state chapter of the contributions to funds.
- C. To serve as ex-officio member of the Finance and Membership Committees without vote.
- **D.** To serve as liaison between Georgia State Chapter and the P.E.O. Foundation.

- **E.** To close the treasurer's books as of March 31 of each year and arrange to have them reviewed by a qualified accountant or auditing committee with the approval of the executive board.
- **F.** To serve as adviser to the Cottey College Committee.
- **G.** To maintain records of named scholarships in the Georgia Scholarship Endowment Fund.

#### **Section 5. SECRETARY** The duties of the secretary shall be

- A. To serve as Program Librarian.
- **B.** To have the proceedings of the convention of the state chapter provided within three months following the date of the meeting to those named in the Constitution, Part II, Article VIII, Section 6, and to others as authorized by the executive board of the state chapter.
- **C.** To notify the local chapters entitled to representation in Convention of International Chapter by February 1 of the year convention is held.
- **D.** To compile the memorial list for the Time of Remembrance ceremony one month prior to convention.
- **E.** To serve as adviser to the International Projects Committee.
- **F.** To serve as ex-officio member, without vote, of the Finance Committee.

**Section 6. ALL OFFICERS** Each state officer shall serve as an Executive Board Buddy for a group of local chapters within the state. The chapters assigned to each officer will remain the same for her entire tenure on the executive board. The chapters assigned to the president will transfer to the new secretary following convention. The duties of each Board Buddy include:

- **A.** To act as the first point of contact with the local chapters assigned to her.
- **B.** To perform Board Buddy Calls each fall with her chapters that are NOT receiving an official visit that year.
- C. To send out the Board Buddy Bulletin to her chapters following each executive board meeting.
- **D.** To receive all six (6) copies of the yearbooks from her Board Buddy chapters, postmarked no later than July 1 of each year.
  - If any are received after the deadline, she will notify the State Treasurer to levy a \$5 fine to the local chapter.
- **E.** To receive the notice of changes to local bylaws and standing rules from each of her chapters by March 10.
  - If any are received after the deadline, she will notify the State Treasurer to levy a \$5 fine to the local chapter.
- F. To review the bylaws of each of her Board Buddy Chapters and to provide feedback.

#### **ARTICLE VII**

#### STANDING COMMITTEES

**Section 1. NAMES** The standing committees of Georgia State Chapter shall be: Amendments and Recommendations, Finance, Grouping, Historian, International Projects, Membership, Nominating, Scholarship, Technology, Unaffiliate Coordinator, and Cottey College. Each committee shall report at the convention of state chapter.

**Section 2. POLICIES** Each committee shall have stated policies of operation which shall have the approval of the executive board.

#### Section 3. AMENDMENTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

- A. Appointment The Amendments and Recommendations Committee shall consist of three members. The president shall appoint a past president of Georgia State Chapter to serve as chairman of the committee for one year. The president shall appoint one member for a two-year term.
- B. Duties The duties of the Amendments and Recommendations Committee shall be:
  - 1. To receive, by November 30, proposed amendments to the state bylaws and the standing rules recommended by local chapter, standing committees of the state chapter, and the executive board.
  - 2. To send a copy of the proposed amendments and/or recommendations in proper form to local chapters, past presidents of the state chapter, the executive board and chairman of the standing committees no later than thirty days preceding Convention of Georgia State Chapter.

**Section 4. HISTORIAN** An historian shall be appointed to keep books or articles deemed worthy of historical interest, and to keep an accurate and current list of such items in the possession, and to collect and preserve data relative to the P.E.O. Sisterhood in Georgia. An assistant historian may be appointed with the approval of the executive board.

#### Section 5. FINANCE

- A. Appointment The Finance Committee shall be composed of three members, at least one of whom shall be a past president of Georgia State Chapter; each serving a three-year term; the senior member in point of service shall be chairman. All members of the state executive board shall be ex-officio members, without vote.
- **B. Duties** The duties of the Finance committee shall be as stated in the Constitution, Part II, Article IX, Section 9:
  - 1. To consult with and advise the executive board of the state chapter on financial affairs.
  - 2. To prepare and present to convention of the state chapter an annual budget of the General Fund, based on the fiscal year, April 1 through March 31. The budget shall be sent to the executive board one week prior to convention of the state chapter.
  - **3.** To prepare and present to convention of state chapter a proposed allocation of state chapter dues.

#### Section 6. GROUPING

- **A. Appointment** The Grouping Committee shall consist of three members, each serving a three-year term and at least one of whom shall be a past president of Georgia State Chapter. The senior member in point of service shall serve as chairman. The vice president shall be adviser to the committee.
- **B. Duties** The duties of the Grouping Committee shall be to determine the grouping of hostess chapters for convention of the state chapter and the sequence of chapters eligible to send delegates to Convention of International Chapter. (See Article I, Section 3 and Article III, Section 1.)

#### Section 7. SCHOLARSHIP

- A. Appointment The Scholarship Committee shall consist of three members, each serving a three-year term, the senior member in point of service shall be chairman. The vice president shall be adviser to the committee.
- **B. Duties** The duties of the Scholarship Committee shall be to receive applications, select recipients and award grants from all funds available. The committee shall announce the scholarship grants at the convention of state chapter.

#### Section 8. MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE

- **A. Appointment** The Membership Committee shall consist of three members, each serving a three-year term, the senior member in point of service shall be chairman. The organizer shall be the adviser. The treasurer and the unaffiliate coordinator shall be ex-officio members without vote.
- **B. Duties** To further the membership goals of P.E.O. International Chapter and Georgia State Chapter by encouraging local chapter engagement in these goals; by facilitating contacts with transfers, inactives and unaffiliates and facilitating the introduction of collegiate P.E.O.s and women not P.E.O.s; by keeping local chapters informed of membership programming changes or updates; by working with the unaffiliate coordinator to assist in dissemination of lists of unaffiliated P.E.O.s to local chapters; and by assisting all areas of membership growth within Georgia State Chapter.

#### Section 9. INTERNATIONAL PROJECTS COMMITTEE

- **A. Appointment** The International Projects Committee shall consist of three members, each serving a three year term; the senior member in point of service shall be chairman. The secretary shall be adviser.
- **B. Duties** The duties of the International Projects Committee shall be to serve as a resource to the local chapters regarding the International Projects: P.E.O. Educational Loan Fund, P.E.O. International Peace Scholarship, P.E.O. Program for Continuing Education, P.E.O. Scholar Awards, and P.E.O. STAR Scholarship. The committee shall be responsible for these project presentations at convention of state chapter.

**Section 10. TECHNOLOGY COMMITTEE** A technology committee shall be appointed to serve as a resource to Georgia State Chapter regarding technology needs. The vice president shall be adviser to this committee.

#### Section 11. COTTEY COLLEGE COMMITTEE

- **A. Appointment** The Cottey College Committee shall consist of three members, each serving a three-year term; the senior member in point of service shall be the chairman. The treasurer shall be the adviser.
- **B. Duties** This committee will promote interest in Cottey College including the dissemination of current information, serving as a resource to local chapters and preparing the project display at convention.

#### **Section 12. NOMINATING COMMITTEE** See Article V, Section 3.

#### Section 13. UNAFFILIATE COORDINATOR

- **A. Appointment** An Unaffiliate Coordinator shall be appointed for a three-year term to prepare and distribute lists of P.E.O. members who are not affiliated with a chapter in the city or area in which they live.
- **B. Duties** The duties of the Unaffiliate Coordinator shall be as follows:
  - 1. To access the International Membership Portal to download unaffiliate information;
  - 2. To organize the information and distribute unaffiliate lists to the Membership Committee;
  - **3.** To interact with the Membership Committee to maximize the connection with unaffiliated P.E.O.s who are seeking a chapter home;
  - **4.** To provide the organizer with lists of unaffiliates who live in areas of the state where new chapters are needed;
  - **5.** To assist the organizer as needed;
  - **6.** To serve as an ex-officio member of the Membership Committee.

#### **ARTICLE VIII**

#### **ORGANIZATION AND OFFICIAL VISITS**

**Section 1. FORMATION** No organization of a new chapter shall take place during thirty days immediately preceding the opening of the convention of the state chapter unless approved by the executive board.

#### Section 2. REQUIREMENTS

- **A.** One P.E.O. may not recommend more than three charter initiates without consent of the state executive board.
- **B.** One not a P.E.O. desiring to become a charter initiate of a chapter shall be recommended by three active P.E.O.s who know her personally. The letters of recommendation shall be sent to the organizer.

#### Section 3. OFFICIAL VISITS TO LOCAL CHAPTERS

- **A.** Each local chapter shall have an official visit by the organizer or her proxy, according to one of the methods established by International Chapter. A full comprehensive visit will be conducted on a rotating basis as scheduled by the executive board.
- **B.** A new chapter shall have a comprehensive visit by the organizer or her proxy for the first three years and then shall be placed in the established rotation.
- **C.** The organizer, with the approval of the executive board, may schedule additional visits to provide extra attention when deemed necessary for the well-being of a chapter.
- **D.** Any chapter may request an official visit any year.

#### **ARTICLE IX**

#### GEORGIA SCHOLARSHIP ENDOWMENT FUND

(Held in the P.E.O. Foundation)

#### Section 1. ESTABLISHMENT

- **A.** The Georgia State Chapter shall establish a fund known as the Georgia Scholarship Endowment Fund to be held and administered by the P.E.O. Foundation. The fund shall consist of voluntary contributions, memorial gifts and bequests.
- **B.** Accrued interest from the fund shall be awarded annually by the Georgia State Scholarship Committee according to policies of the committee and requirements of the P.E.O. Foundation.
- **C.** The first scholarship to be awarded each year from the Georgia Scholarship Endowment Fund shall be known as the Ruth Tabor Fox Scholarship.

#### Section 2. NAMED SCHOLARSHIPS

- **A.** A named scholarship may be added to the Georgia Scholarship Endowment Fund by making a one-time minimum contribution of \$3,000.00 to the fund by February 1st.
- **B.** Once a named scholarship has been established it will be awarded annually and announced at the annual Convention of Georgia State Chapter.
- **C.** The treasurer will maintain records of named scholarships in the Georgia Scholarship Endowment Fund.

**Section 3. DISPOSITION OF FUND** If, by a three-fourths vote of two consecutive conventions of Georgia State Chapter, it is determined that the Georgia Scholarship Endowment Fund held in the P.E.O. Foundation shall be discontinued, all assets of the fund shall be applied and distributed to a qualified charitable or educational project or projects in accordance with policies of the P.E.O. Foundation. This project or projects shall be selected by a three-fourths vote of the convention taking action and discontinuing the Georgia Scholarship Endowment Fund or at the following convention of the state chapter.

# ARTICLE X SPECIAL DUTIES OF LOCAL CHAPTER OFFICERS and LOCAL CHAPTERS (See Article IV, Section 8)

#### Section 1. PRESIDENT

- **A.** It shall be the duty of each president to send a letter to the state president by the end of February, giving in detail increase or decrease in membership, average attendance, contributions to and promotion of the P.E.O. projects and other philanthropic work, program features, social activities, spirit of cooperation and interest in chapter life. A copy of this letter shall be sent to nonresident members and to resident members unable to attend meetings regularly.
- **B.** The president shall see that six chapter yearbooks are sent to the chapter's designated executive board buddy postmarked no later than July 1.

#### Section 2. CORRESPONDING SECRETARY

The annual report of the corresponding secretary shall be postmarked by March 10.

#### Section 3. RECORDING SECRETARY

- **A.** If local chapter bylaws or standing rules have been amended during the year, the recording secretary shall send one complete copy of the bylaws and standing rules to the chapter's designated executive board buddy by March 10. This copy shall be sent electronically.
- **B.** If no changes have been made during the year, the recording secretary shall indicate such in an electronic submission to the chapter's executive board buddy by March 10.

#### Section 4. TREASURER

- **A.** The treasurer shall be responsible for keeping opportunities of the P.E.O. Foundation available to the members. She shall give a brief report of the P.E.O. Foundation annually to her chapter.
- **B.** The annual report of the treasurer shall be postmarked by March 10.

#### ARTICLE XI

#### **RECIPROCITY GROUPS**

**Section 1. PURPOSE** Local chapters or their representatives, in cities with two or more chapters, may unite for one or more of the following purposes: to welcome unaffiliated P.E.O. members, to further the acquaintance of all members in the city, and to promote the projects of the Sisterhood.

**Section 2. SUPERVISION** The vice president shall serve as adviser to reciprocity groups.

#### Section 3. ORGANIZATION

- **A.** Local chapters wishing to form a reciprocity group shall send a written request signed by the president of each chapter to the vice president of Georgia State Chapter. Consent to unite shall be granted by the executive board of the state chapter.
- **B.** Provision for financing the group must be made by each local chapter, in accordance with the bylaws of the group.

**Section 4. REPORTS** Election reports shall be submitted immediately after election as required by International Chapter. The annual financial report required by International Chapter shall be submitted by March 10. The president shall send an annual report to the vice president of the state chapter by April 10.

#### **ARTICLE XII**

#### **AMENDMENTS**

**Section 1. VOTING** These bylaws may be amended by a two-thirds vote of members present and voting at any convention of Georgia State Chapter.

**Section 2. PROCEDURE** Proposed changes must be endorsed by a chapter, a standing committee, or the executive board and shall be submitted in writing to the members of the Amendments and Recommendations Committee and the president of the state chapter by November 30. Local chapters desiring to submit an amendment must have that proposal approved by a two-thirds vote at a regular business meeting, provided the amendment was submitted in writing at a previous regular business meeting and all absent resident members notified that a vote will be taken at the next regular business meeting. Proposed changes shall be distributed to those specified in Article VII, Section 3, subsection B.2 no later than thirty days preceding convention of the state chapter.

#### G. YEARBOOK DISTRIBUTION

- **2.** Each local chapter shall be responsible for submitting any outstanding program material to the state program file under the direction of the state vice president.
- 3. Any official letter to the local chapter(s) from a member of the executive board or a chairman of a standing committee shall be sent to the president of the state chapter for approval before a final draft is made.
- **4.** Names of deceased members of a chapter received by the secretary of the state chapter one month prior to convention of the state chapter will appear on the Memorial Roll of that convention.
- **5.** In the case of appointment of a new revolving committee, the state president shall designate chairman, second and third member.
- **6.** If a chapter chooses not to print their bylaws and standing rules in their yearbook, each member will be provided a current copy of the chapter's bylaws and standing rules.
- 7. Proposed changes must be endorsed by a chapter, a standing committee, or the executive board and shall be submitted in writing to the members of the Amendments and Recommendations Committee and the president of the state chapter by November 30. Proposed changes shall be distributed to those specified in Article VII, Section 3, subsection B.2 for consideration no later than thirty days preceding convention of the state chapter. A standing rule shall be adopted or suspended by a majority vote. A vote to suspend applies only to the meeting at which the vote is taken.
