Program Inspiration


This original program was inspired by Deloitte International's value mapping tool. In 16 minutes, it is a program that engages its audience actively, honors our 7 Founding sisters, leverages our marguerite, and explores 7 "must haves" for chapter success and the drivers that are needed to achieve them. It is a useful program, both for Founders' Day and as a tool chapters can use to help set annual goals.

Staffing

You will need 8 sisters to present the program: 7 sisters representing our 7 founders and a moderator. Suggested attire: black slacks and white tops.

Logistics and Supplies

- Stage set up:
 - Easels with pictures of each of our Founders
 - Small table for the narrator
 - o 8 chairs
 - 1 wireless mic
- Sisters:
 - White foam board petals, each with a "must have" written on the front and with a script attached on the back
- Moderator:
 - Daisy center (gold charger plate)
 - Stopwatch (on mobile phone)
- Attendees:
 - Worksheet form for capturing ideas



Daisy pens (provided as a gift to encourage participation)

Expenses

- Foam board (7 white sheets at \$1 each from the Dollar Store)
- Worksheet forms (enough for all participants, on 65# cardstock... about \$5)
- Daisy pens (boxes of 11 pens @ \$13.99 each, purchased from Amazon)



Program Script

Time: 90 seconds

Program Start: Narrator

Hello sisters, I am [Name], [president] of Chapter [__], and a P.E.O. since [year].

Elapsed time: 1.5 minutes

Inspired by our flower, the Marguerite, today's program is "7 Petals for Chapter Success." With me today are 7 of my sisters, representing our 7 Founders.

In less than a minute, each sister will introduce herself, the Founder she represents, and share a few words about her petal.

Each petal is something chapters need for success. Our Marguerite does not bloom without us, so each sister will share actions that contribute to her petal. Then you will be invited to think of ideas — actions your chapter could take — for each petal.

On your table is a Ziploc bag of folded cards and sparkly daisy pens for recording your ideas. Please take a card and pen now. [Wait] Please write your chapter's letter on your card. You do not have to write your name.

The pen is your gift for participating today. When our program is finished, put your card back in the Ziploc bag and Chapter [__] will collect them. We will compile the results and share them with all chapters.

Running time: 16 minutes

Closing Remarks: Narrator

Thank you, sisters! Please stand up.

Each of your petals is one of the "7 Petals for Chapter Success." Each is important, and none alone is enough.

But when Shared Purpose, Members, Leaders, Effective Operations, Brand Awareness, Project Candidates, and Financial Resources come together...

[Narrator lifts the daisy center, and all sisters come together with their petals to make a single Marguerite.]

And when they fit together, [1, 2, 3]

[Say together]: There's nothing we P.E.O.s can't do!

[Sisters return to their places.]

Thank you, everyone, for participating today. We hope our program spurred new ideas. Please put your cards back the Ziploc bag, and my sisters will collect them from your tables.

Sisters place their petals on their seat and leave the stage.

Each gathers cards from 1–2 tables.
